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# Introduction

The Planning Framework is the collation of planning data for each specific LGA in a defined area and their Local Planning Area and is a working document.

The Planning Framework is developed through a collaborative process with the Department of Ageing Disability and Home Care, the Local Council Aged and Disability Workers and the community care sector.

The intent of this document is to:

- describe the currently available information and data on the area, including demographics, service system, specialist services within the generic system, DADHC funding and the roles played by various organisations within the framework; and
- track issues affecting the area, with a view to identifying service gaps and possible innovative service projects that may benefit the area.

An analysis of the information contained in the document may result in various responses, outcomes and expectations including:

- increase in funding;
- amalgamation of services;
- coordination of service types;
- review of service models; and
- additional mapping and more in depth information.

The document will be reviewed, on a regular basis with the Local Council Aged and Disability Worker and the community care sector, both through formal meetings and through informal processes.

Similar Frameworks are available for:

- Northern Sydney Local Planning Area; and
- Nepean Local Planning Area.

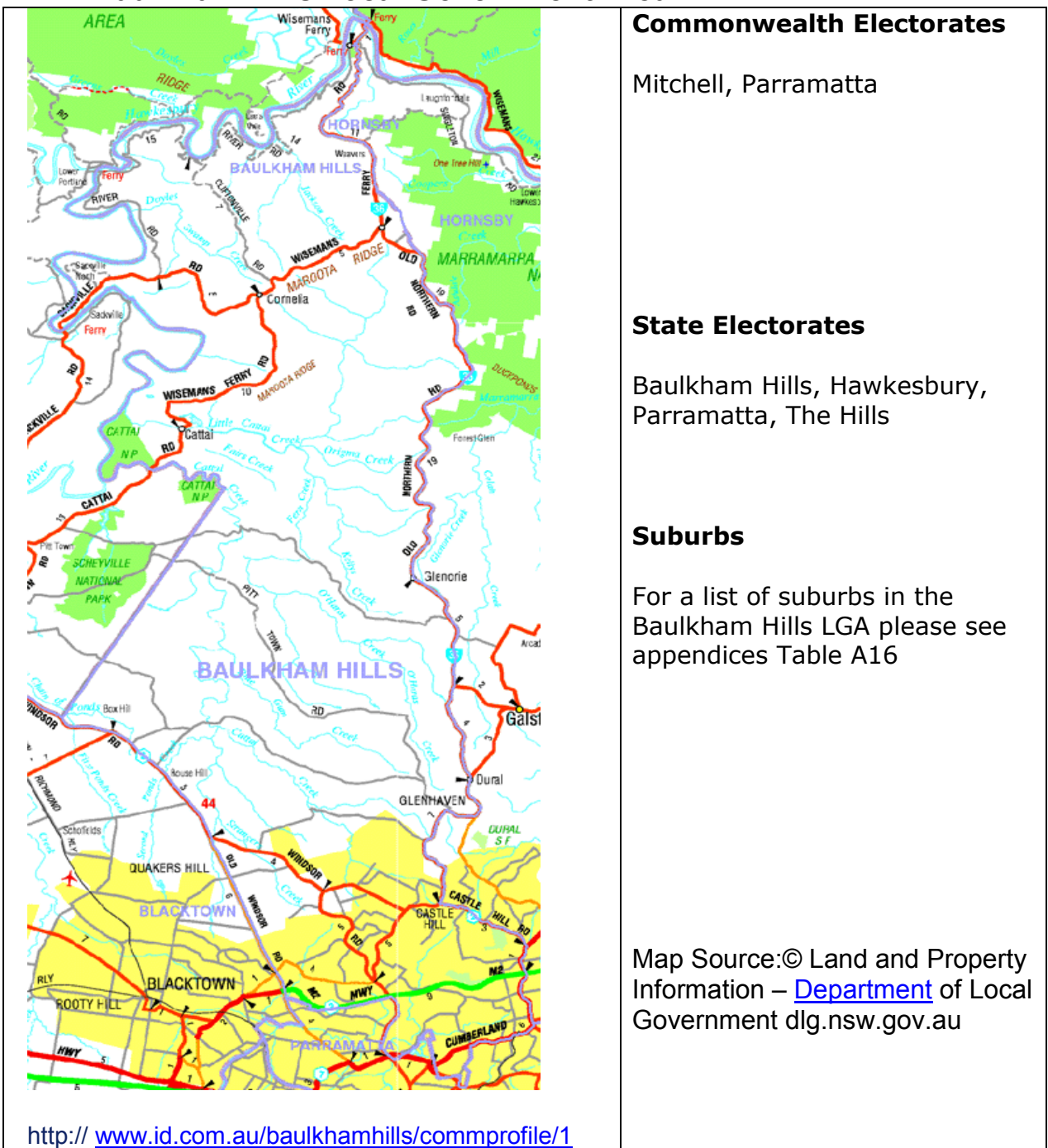


# 1. Area Profile

## 1.1 Geography

Metro North Region consists of 3 Local Planning Areas, Cumberland Prospect, Nepean and Northern Sydney Local Planning Areas. The Cumberland Prospect Local Planning Area covers Auburn, Holroyd, Parramatta, Blacktown and Baulkham Hills Local Government Areas (LGAs). The geographic area covered in this Framework is the Baulkham Hills LGA.

### 1.1.1 Baulkham Hills Local Government Area



The Baulkham Hills shire is located approximately 30 kilometres northwest of Sydney. It is an area in the north western region of Sydney, stretching from Oatlands in the south, to Wisemans Ferry in the north. It is known as "The Garden Shire", in view of the rolling hills, bushland, market gardens and urban sprawl. The shire is one of the larger and fastest growing Local Government Areas in Sydney, with two thirds being rural land used for farming and other agricultural industries. Residents enjoy a mix of urban and rural lifestyles creating interesting contrasts from restaurants and modern shopping facilities, to roadside stalls and peaceful bushland areas.

The original inhabitants of the Baulkham Hills area were the Darug people. The Darug were the custodians of the majority of what is now the Greater Sydney region.

The Baulkham Hills shire has experienced strong population growth over the past decade and has more than 150,000 residents. It has 29 suburbs and 4 localities. Its administrative centre is located in the suburb of Castle Hill. It is estimated that the urban and commercial development in the Rouse Hill area will add a further 40,000 to the population over the next 15-20 years.

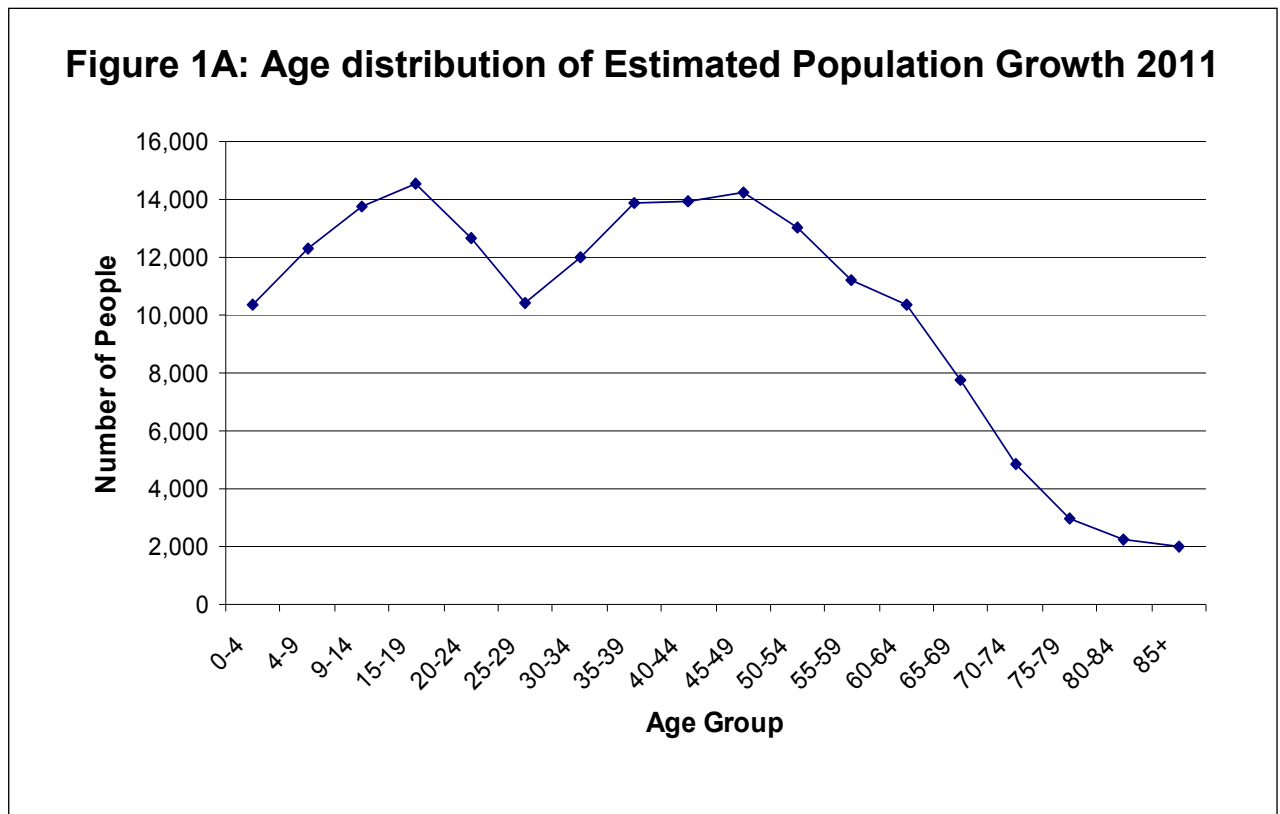
## 1.2 Population

Population summary for the Baulkham Hills LGA follows:

### 1.2.1 General Population

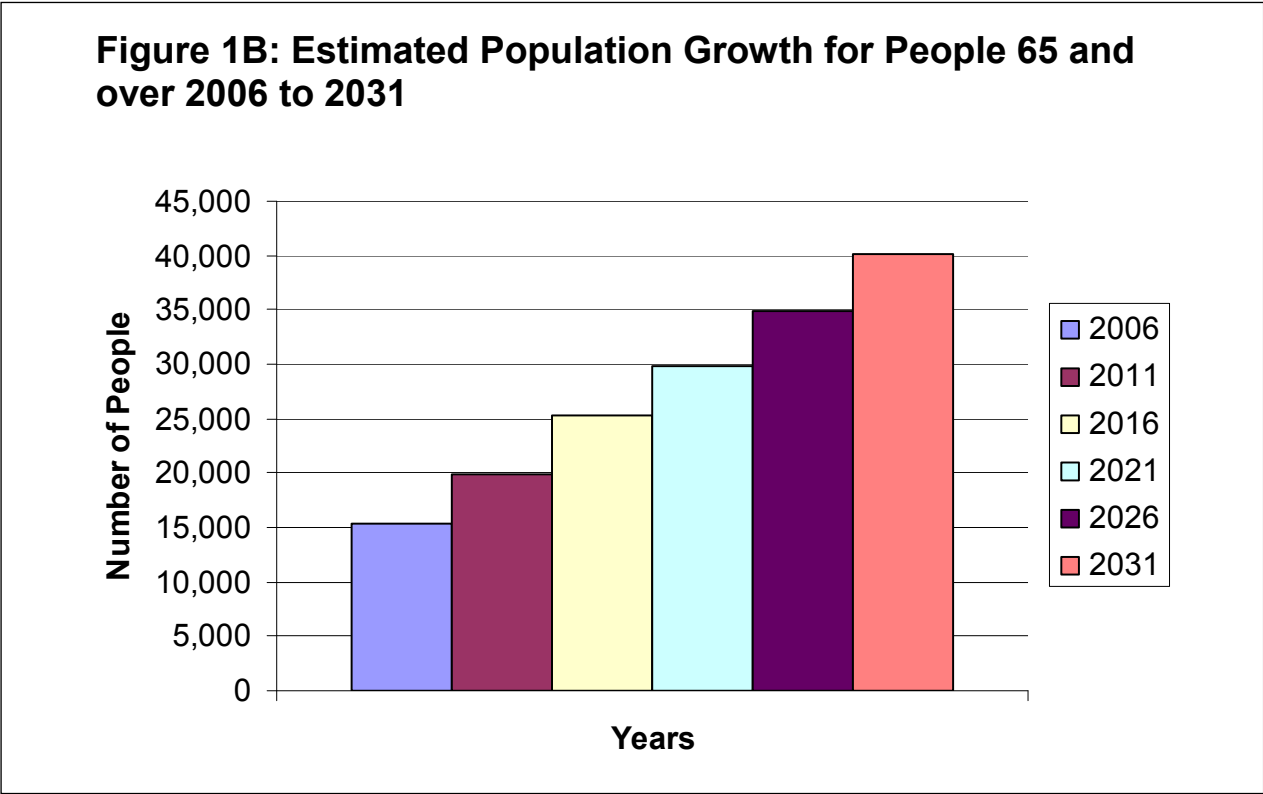
The population of Australia in August 2006 was 19,855,288. In NSW the population was 6,549,177 which represented 33% of the total Australian population (Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) 2006 Census).

The total population in Baulkham Hills was 159,391 according to the ABS 2006 Census. This represents an increase of 32.6% in the years 1996 – 2006. Between the years 1996 – 2001 there was a 16.3% increase and a 14% increase between 2001 and 2006. The NSW Government has projected the population in the Baulkham Hills LGA to increase to 182,610 in 2011 and 249,080 in 2031. (See Tables A1, A2 and A3 in appendix.)

## 1.2.2 Population Density

Population density in the LGA of Baulkham Hills is 397.9 persons per square kilometre which is significantly lower than the average population density for the Cumberland Prospect Local Planning Area (948).

### 1.2.3 Age Distribution

There is an increasing ageing of the population in NSW with 18.7% of the total population in NSW aged 60 years and over compared to 17.3% in 2001. This is also higher than the national average of 18.1% (ABS 2006 Census data).

According to 2006 Census data, the median age of the population in Blacktown was 36 years compared with 37 years for persons in NSW and Australia. (See Table A4 in appendix.)

In the Baulkham Hills Local Government Area the proportion of age groups is as follows:

- 21.7% of the population under 15 years;
- 14.7% is in the 15 to 24 year age group;
- 42.4% is in the 25 -54 year age group;
- 12.2% is in the 55 – 64 age group;
- 9% is 65 years and over.

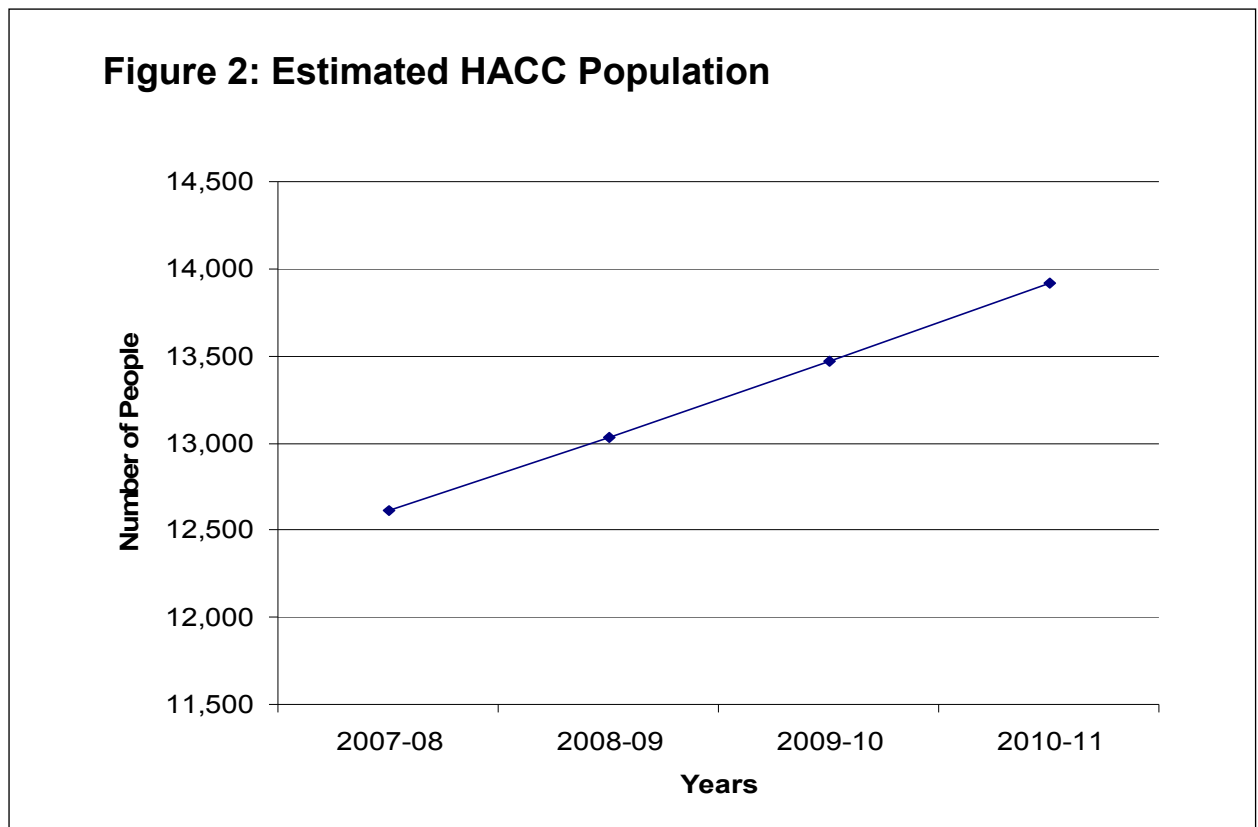

## 1.2.4 Home and Community Care (HACC) Target Group

The HACC target population in NSW is estimated to rise from 577,751 to 597,256 between the years 2007/08 to 2010/11. This represents an increase of 19,505 persons. In the Baulkham Hills Local Government Area, the HACC target population is estimated to rise from 12,608 persons in 2007/08 to 13,914 persons in 2010/2011, an increase of 1306 persons.

The proportion of people within a LGA receiving HACC services is positively related to the level of financial disadvantage. In other words, as the financial disadvantage of a LGA increases so too does the proportion of the LGA receiving HACC services. The Index of Economic Resources (IER) reflects the profile of the economic resources of families within areas. Higher scores indicate that the area has a higher proportion of families on high income, a lower proportion of low income families, and more households living in large houses.

The IER for the Baulkham Hills LGA is 1183 which is higher than the IER for the Cumberland Prospect LPA of 1055 and the NSW IER of 1031. (ABS Index of Economic Resources, 2001).



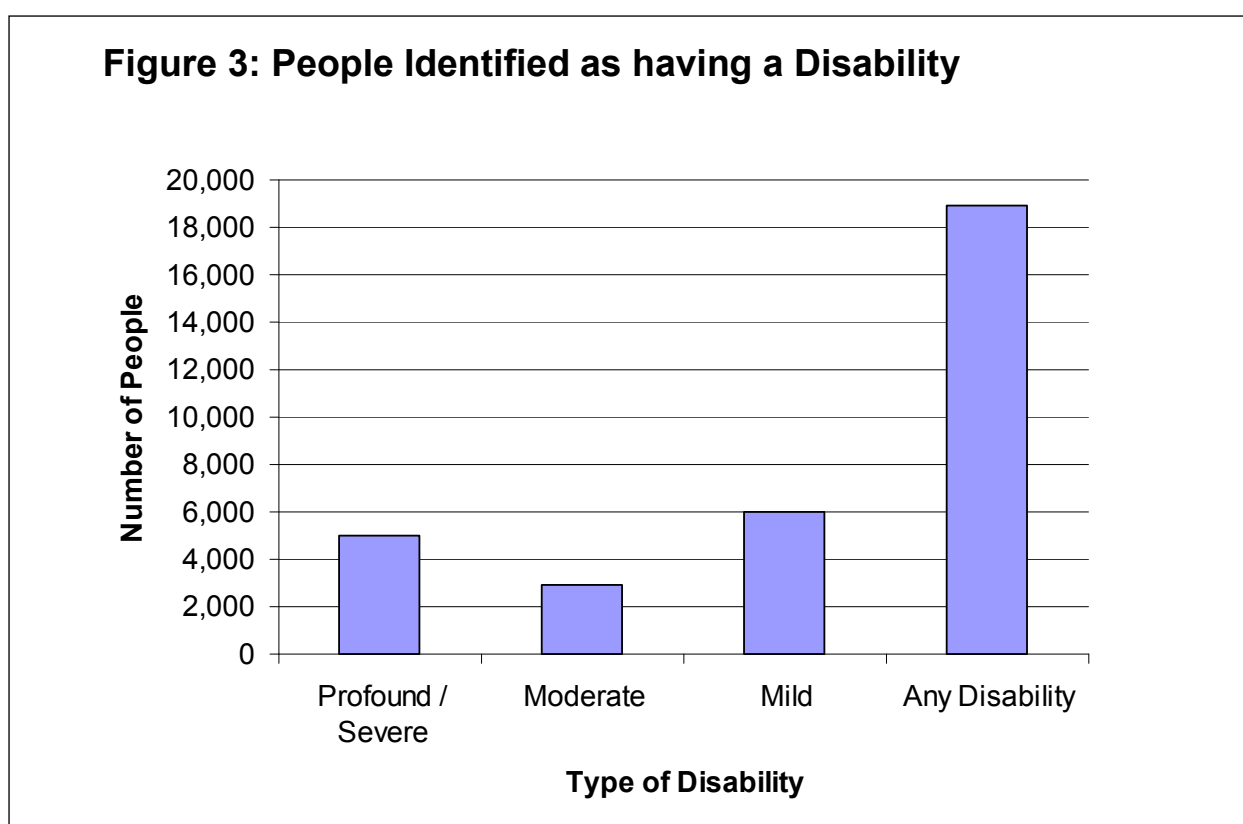

## 1.2.5 People with Disabilities

The estimated total population of people with a disability in the Baulkham Hills LGA is 19,089 persons. (ABS Synthetic Estimates of Disability 2003 Survey of Disability, Ageing and Carers data.)

- 26.2% have an estimated profound/severe disability;
- 15% have an estimated moderate disability;
- 31% have an estimated mild disability; and
- 27.8% have an estimated any disability.

(ABS synthetic estimates from the survey data 2003), (see Table A3 in appendix.)

Note: Any Disability includes Profound, Severe, Moderate, mild limitations as well as schooling or employment restriction and Disability with no restriction or limitation.

The percentage of the population in the Baulkham Hills LGA with a profound or severe core activity limitation (who reported needing assistance in at least one of the three core activities, ie self care, mobility and communication) was 2.3% (3,635 persons) compared to 4.2% in NSW.

The highest percentage of people in the Baulkham Hills LGA with a profound or severe core activity limitation was in the 85 years and over age group, followed by the 75 – 84 years age group.

- 661 persons or 49% of the 85 years and over age group;

- 835 persons or 19% of the 75 -84 years age group.

Consistent with the national and NSW pattern, the rate in these age groups is higher for females than males in the Baulkham Hills LGA. (See Table A7 in appendix.)

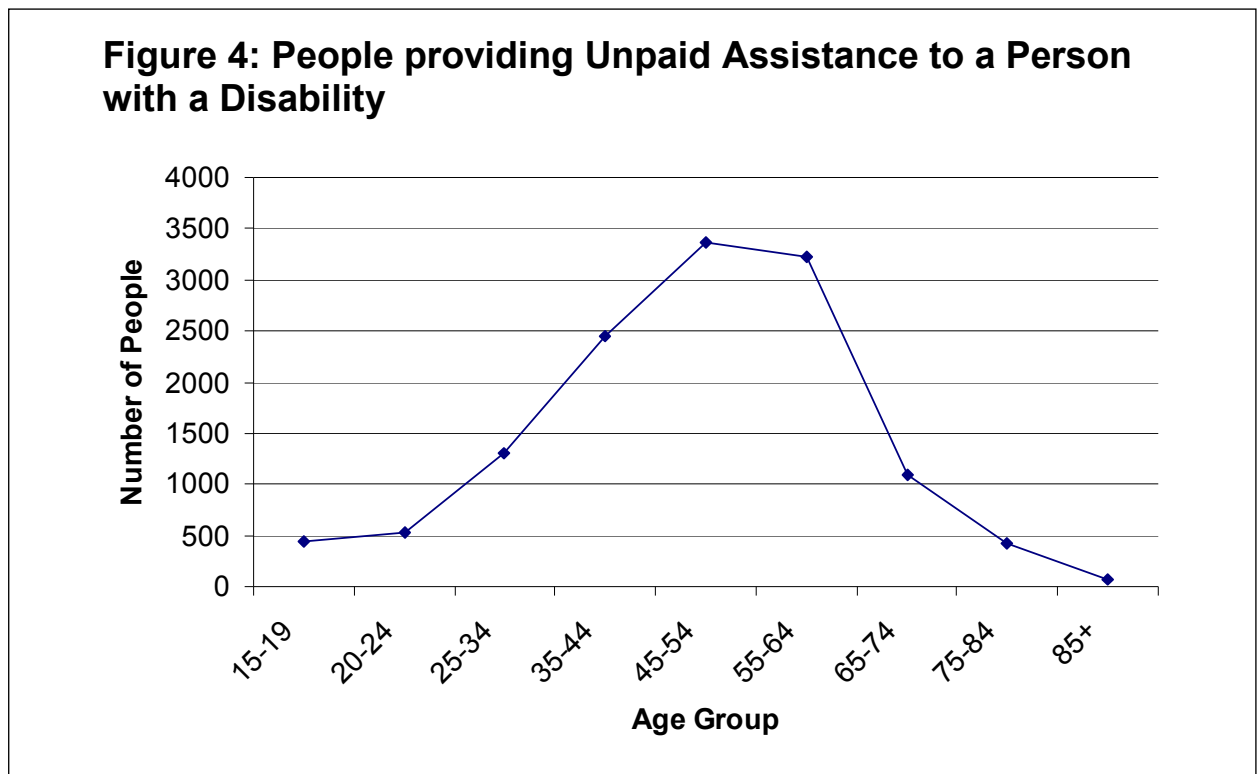
Indigenous people accounted for 2.1% of the population in NSW but made up 2.5% of people with a profound or severe disability, reflecting the higher disability prevalence rate (5%) amongst the indigenous community. In contrast to the pattern of the general population, indigenous males were more likely to have a profound or severe core activity limitation than females (ABS 2006 Census data).

## 1.2.6 Unpaid Carers

Of all persons aged 15 years and over in NSW, 10.4% provided unpaid assistance to those who needed help because of a disability, a long term illness or problems related to old age (in the two weeks before the Census night). This includes people who were in receipt of the Carer Allowance or Carer Payment (ABS 2006 Census data).

In the Baulkham Hills LGA the number of unpaid carers according to the ABS 2006 Census data was 12,892 representing 10.3% of the 15 years and over population. The 45 to 54 years age group and the 55 to 64 years age group had the highest percentage of age group population as unpaid carers with 13.9% and 16.5% respectively. (See Table A8 in appendix.)

In NSW Indigenous people were more likely to provide care than the general population, 12.4% of Indigenous providing care, compared to 10.4% for the general population. Similar to the general population, the majority of Indigenous carers were female and people aged 25-54 dominated the carer group (ABS 2006 Census data).

## 1.2.7 Type of Household

Around half of the households in the general population live in couple households, followed by 22% of households with a child under 15 years of age. 3% of all households are lone parent households. (See Table 2A below.)

According to 2006 Census data there were 13,109 people over 65 years living in the Baulkham Hills LGA with significant numbers of those persons living alone. The following Family Type and relationship in the household table gives an indication of living status of older people. (See Table 2B below and Table A9 in appendix.)

## 1.2.9 Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) Populations

In the 2006 Census, 66.1% of persons usually resident in the Baulkham Hills LGA stated they were born in Australia. Other common responses within Baulkham Hills LGA were:

- 3.8% England;
- 2.4% China;
- 1.9% Hong Kong;
- 1.8% India;
- 1.6% New Zealand.

In the 2006 Census, English was stated as the only language spoken at home by 72.5% of persons usually resident in Baulkham Hills Local Government Area. The most common languages other than English spoken at home were:

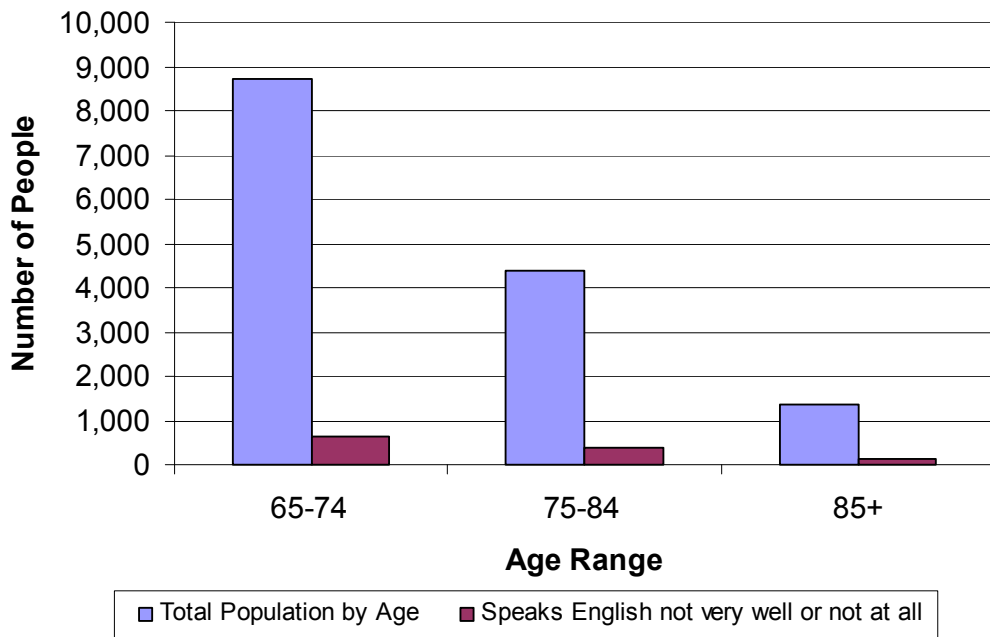
- 4.5% Cantonese;
- 2.4% Mandarin;
- 1.8% Arabic;
- 1.6% Korean;
- 1.4% Italian.

Of the older population the following proportions stated that they spoke English Not Well or Not at All;

- 7.10% of the 65 – 74 years group (623 persons);
- 8.8% of the 75 – 84 years group (385 persons);
- 9.3% of the 85 years group (125 persons) stated that they spoke English not well or not at all.

### **1.2.10 Aboriginal Population**

The Aboriginal population for the Local Government Area (LGA) is 431 which accounts for 0.3% of the total population of Baulkham Hills LGA compared to 2.1 of the total population of NSW and 2.3% of the total population in Australia. (See Table A14 in appendix.)

Indigenous people accounted for 2.1% of the population in NSW but made up 2.5% of people with a profound or severe disability, reflecting the higher disability prevalence rate (5%) amongst Indigenous community. In contrast to the pattern of the general population, Indigenous males were more likely to have a profound or severe core activity limitation than females (ABS 2006 Census data).

## 1.2.11 People with Dementia

It is estimated that by 2050, the total number of Australians with dementia will increase to 2.8% of the population, a fourfold increase since 2000. The report "Dementia Estimates and Projections NSW and its Regions" developed by Access Economics Pty Ltd for Alzheimer's Australia, indicates that as a proportion of the NSW population, the number of people with dementia is projected to increase from 1.0% in 2002 to 2.7% in 2050.

There is however considerable variation between regions. Western and South Western Sydney currently have the lowest rates of dementia prevalence (as a proportion of the area's population), but are projected to witness the largest increases in dementia prevalence between 2002 and 2050. Western Sydney will experience a fourfold increase from 7,000 to 28,000 people over the forecast period, see Table 4 below.

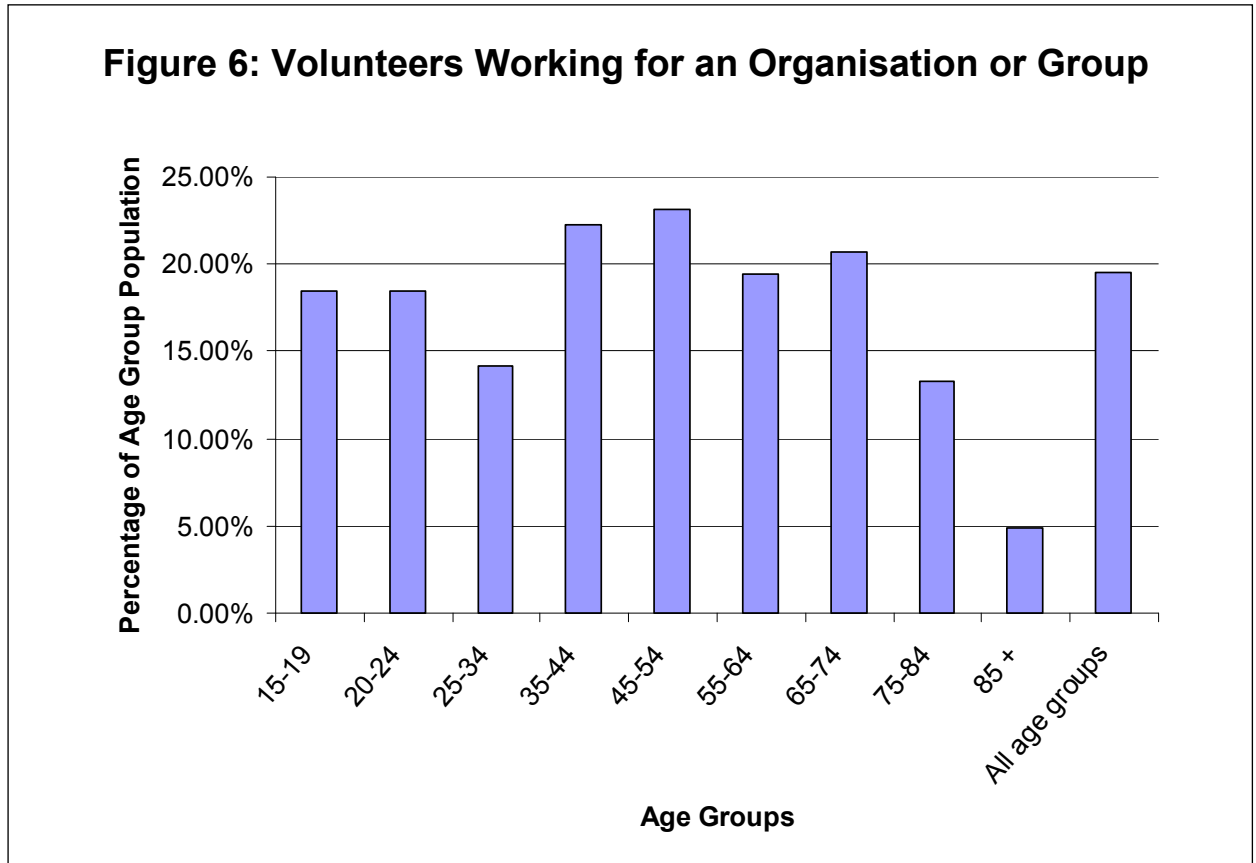

## 1.2.12 Volunteers

According to the 2006 Census, 24,310 persons or 19.5% of the total population 15 years and over, in the Baulkham Hills LGA did some volunteering for an organisation or a group in the 12 months prior to Census night. Of those persons 56.9% were female and 43.1% male.

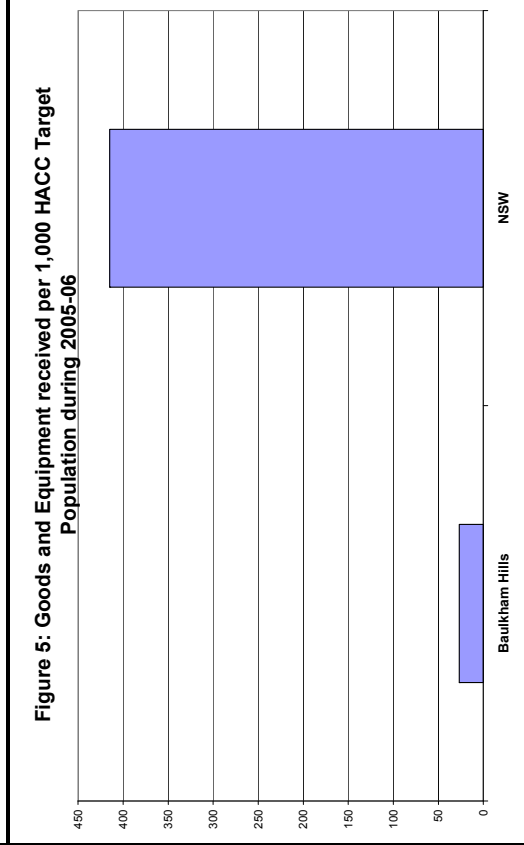
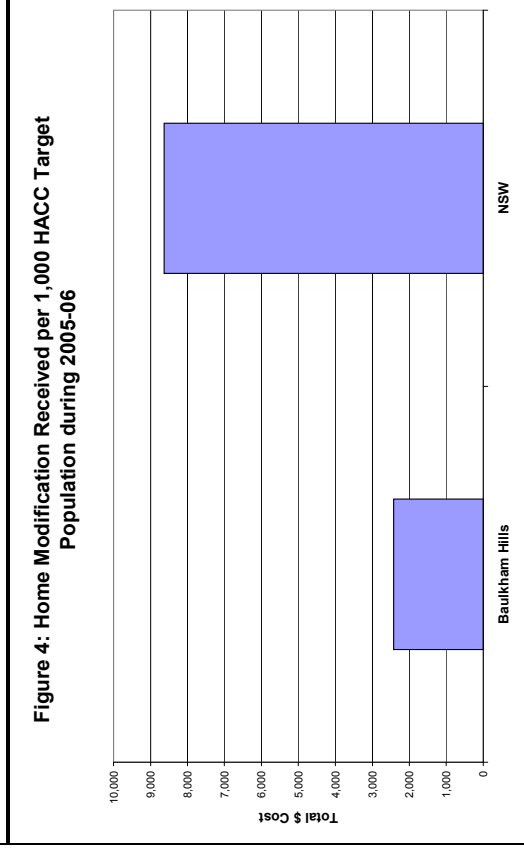
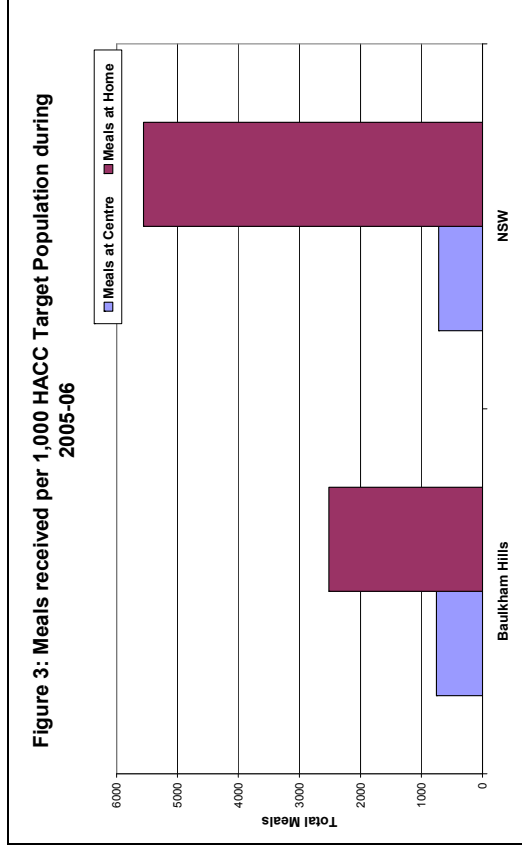
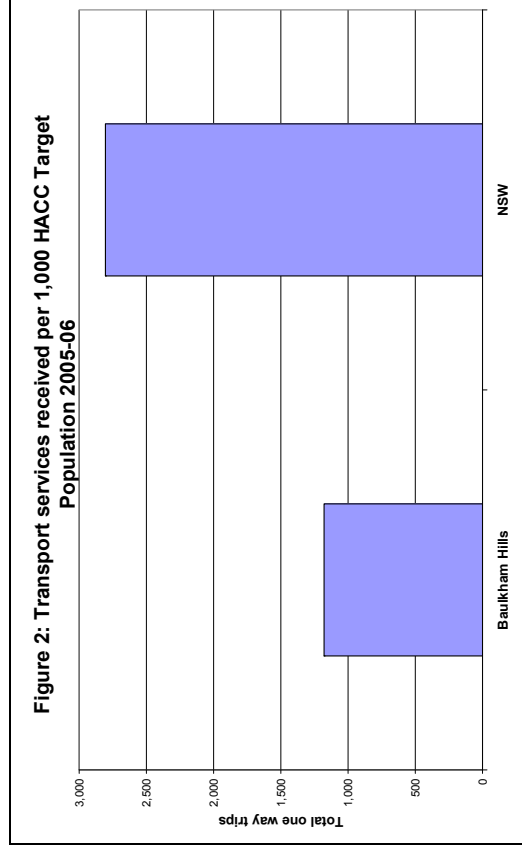
### 3. Service Outputs

It can be seen in Figure 1 below that the HACC Services received per 1,000 HACC target population in Baulkham Hills are significantly over State averages in Centre Based Day Care and significantly under in Domestic Assistance, Social Support and Respite Care.
